Mark your calendars for November 26th, 2022. The holiday get together is on at Jozzanas Casual Italian Restaurant. The time is 12 noon until 3:30pm. The cost is \$20/person. Gratuity not included.

The restaurant is located at 409 Lincoln Blvd. Middlesex NJ. The parking lot cannot accommodate motor homes so just bring your car. The restaurant is located in the same general area as The Willows Restaurant in Green Brook a number of years ago and the Chinese Buffet in Manville that TCW has been going to for the last few years.

The meal will include house salad, appetizer, a choice of entree (3 items including chicken, eggplant, and flounder francais. All with pasta.) Also a dessert and coffee, tea, or soda. The gratuity is not included in the above mentioned price. You can, if you desire, bring an alcoholic beverage. The owner may even sing for you. He has a great voice, sounding like the Italian singer Mario Lanza.

Please call Matt to let me know you are going so I can give a count for the reservation by November 15th. Ellen and I have been there numerous times and have enjoyed the food, atmosphere, and singing every meal. Again give me a call to let me know you are attending.

(Take Rt 70 to Okeechobee and turn south on Rt 441, then right onto a feeder road just before McDonald's to Silver Palms entrance).

The winter snow bird season is coming to an end so why not start the 2023 rally season a bit early for those that are in Fl. Or even those who want to travel south. Join Ellen and I at Silver Palms RV Resort. It is only a 1/2 mile from Lake Okeechobee. The resort is full of amenities starting with E/W/S. They have a beautiful pool that can be enjoyed while listening to music from a band or having lunch from the kitchen at the pool. Walk around on the black top roads and enjoy the beautiful landscaping of the resort and all the sites before heading north. If you like to stay busy, we have cornhole, shuffle board, horseshoes, organized card games, and a billiard room.



The menu is not put together yet, but we are looking at happy hours and ice cream social. Cost is #75/night. It is regularly \$105, so I was able to negotiate a decent discount considering it is prime time. Cost for meals will be forth coming. Be prepared, for some, the resort will ask how old your coach is. If over 10yrs old, they may ask for a picture of the coach to verify it is presentable, which I don't think anyone in the chapter should have a challenge with.

PLEASE call the resort at 888-323-4967 to make your reservation and pay for the number of nights you will be staying. Absolutely mention you are with 20th Century Wagontrainers so you will be placed in the correct area of the resort, BEFORE Dec 15th 2022. I have 6 sites, not counting mine, reserved. If we have over 6, I will talk to the resort and attempt to get more. Due to Hurricane Ian, and the destruction to the west coast, the resort is filling up sooner than normal since many of the west coast campgrounds were devastated. After making the reservation, please call me, the host, (Matt) to let me know that you are attending. Again please reserve before Dec 15th. See y'all soon.

Attention, Attention, new rally, new location, fun, fun, fun. May 11th to the 14, 2023, at Fort Valley Ranch Campground near beautiful Shenandoah National Forest in Fort Valley, Virginia. Search the name to find out some information on the area. Cost for the campground will be \$40 per night for 2 nights and \$35 for the third night for \$115. Arrive on a Thurs and depart Sunday. Cost for the rally/food has not been determined. PLEASE call the campground at 540-933-6633 by Jan 30th, earlier would be better, and tell them you are with TCW to make the reservation. After making the reservation, please call me, the host, to let me know that you are attending. If you desire to stay longer, or come earlier, do not hesitate to ask.

The area is only minutes away Luray Caverns, wineries and a zoo. The campground offers trail rides for the adventurous person. We will have water and electric with a dump station near the exit. There are specific directions to get to the campground instead of following GPS. Upon making your reservation, you will receive a confirmation email that will give you those directions. Looking forward to some fun.

Directions:

From Virginia Beach take I-64 West to highway 81 North, then take exit 279, follow signs for 675 east, then left on 11 (it may not be marked.. but it is the next intersection "T", then turn right on 675 east to go through Edinburgh Gap Road and at Kings Crossing, turn right and then take an IMMEDIATE right onto South Fort Valley Road (at the fork). Continue about 1.5 miles to driveway on right.

If coming from the north on I-81, take exit 279, follow signs for 675 east, then turn left. Turn left on 11 (it may not be marked.. but it is the next intersection "T", then turn right on 675 east to go through Edinburgh Gap Road and at Kings Crossing, turn right and then take an IMMEDIATE right onto South Fort Valley Road (at the fork). Continue about 1.5 miles to driveway on right.
