

Fustatel Masins Fastern Sharps Flats April 2023 News Letter







D y almost every measure, the 106th International Convention & RV Expo in Perry, Georgia was a huge success for the Frustrated Maestros. We use the term "almost" mainly because we had to deal with some pretty cold weather for both rehearsals and performances in our venue: Town Center, an open, unheated building. Temperatures in the 30's brought back memories of High School and College marching band days to many of us, but with enough layers of clothing along with hats and gloves, we soldiered through it. The chilly mornings had some minor impact on the number of attendees willing to get out of their warm beds to get their "free donuts", but those who did were entertained by some great music. The Ice Cream Social held on Friday afternoon was a different story. The house was packed—a captive audience for our noontime performance.

The Maestro turnout for the rally was wonderful. We had a full trumpet section (4), a full sax section (3), and a full trombone section (2). In addition we had a flute, a French horn, a tuba, and a rhythm section of drums, guitars, banjoes and keyboard and of course, a great chorus. Several of our members were new members that have joined us in the last nine months. Our Director for the Rally was one of those. Sue Siegler and her husband Ari joined us last fall and this was their first time to play with the Maestros. Sue had come expecting to play her flute, but as a retired music teacher, she was quickly recruited to direct, leaving Paul Monat free to fill a much needed position on the tuba (and occasional cornet solo). Needless to say, Sue did a wonderful job. Her high energy and teacher mentality not only endeared her to the Maestros, but also made her a real crowd pleaser. Ari was a wonderful addition to the trumpet section. Other first time performers included Burt and Susan Bicksler (vocals & guitar), Don Black (sax), David and Marie Breeding (vocals, guitar & banjo), Susan Walter (banjo), and Kathy Fuller (keyboard). [Kathy is not a new member, but she graciously agreed to fill a much needed position on the keyboard.

The Frustrated Maestros were called upon to lead the singing of the National Anthems at the Opening Ceremony Wednesday evening. Rosemarie Ladue sang O' Canada, accompanied by Nancy Derkowski on the flute.

Walt Porter sang *The Star-Spangled Banner* accompanied by a saxophone trio of Nick Hefner, Cliff Freed, and Don Black. Both anthems were awesome!

Music for the Rally came from a combination of the Eastern Area Library (aka GEAR Books), the Marston Library (aka Yellow pages), Pop Classics, and a few other pieces brought by individuals for ensembles. We played crowd pleasers like 76 Trombones, Rock Around the Clock, Beer Barrel Polka, New York, New York, Military Escort, America the Beautiful, God Bless America and many, many more. Soloists featured Sally Friedlander singing Summer Time, Paul Monat (Vocal & Cornet) in a Louis Armstrong version of What a Wonderful World, Steve Schultz featured on the drums with South Rampart Street Parade and Wipe Out and a duet of Ari Siegler and Paul Monat playing Trumpeter's Lullaby. An ensemble led by Ben Woods performed a medley which included blue grass, patriotic and folk songs. The chorus was featured with them on Blowin' in the Wind. And finally, the programs ended with Maestro favorites like On the Road Again and God Be With You Till We Meet Again (Amen).

Another big plus for us at Perry was recruiting. With just shy of 2000 RV's attending, there were a lot of people. The Chapter Fair drew a huge crowd, and the activity at the Maestro Table was fruitful. Likewise, our Block Party, with food and entertainment was also fruitful. In the last nine months (beginning with GEAR) we have added a total 14 Maestro performers (nine RV families) to the Eastern Sharps & Flats roles, with more membership applications expected to come in.


